Phileas Fogg has to go around the world in eighty days if he has to win the wager. As he and his companions struggle to do this, Fogg gets arrested by Detective Fix for no fault of his causing a crucial delay. Missing his train from Liverpool due to the wrongful arrest by Fix, who thinks he is a bank robber, in anger and fearing the loss of the wager, physically confronts Detective Fix, whom he holds responsible.

2) Describe the character of 'Aouda', in the novel 'Around the World in Eighty Days'.

Aouda had a tough time in India. She was nearly killed by her persecutors (Sati), but Fogg managed to save her and bring her to England with him. She was a wonderful person and I am grateful for what he did. Aouda apologized for the delay caused by her perilous situation. he was very loving and self-respecting. In what way was Mr Fogg's final winning the wager connected with Aouda?

Fogg wanted to marry Aouda, so he sent Passepartout to tell the Reverend about their plan. They thought they would get married on Monday, but it was actually Sunday. They arrived a day early, giving them a chance to win the bet. Aouda's role in fixing the mistake indirectly helped them win.

Comment on the Theme of the Extract given in the novel, 'Around the World in Eighty Days'.

Phileas Fogg tries to travel around the world in 80 days for a bet. He faces problems like getting arrested and missing trains, making him worry about losing. In the end, crossing the International Date Line gives him an extra day, and he wins. The message is that time is beyond our control; it keeps moving, and we have to go along with it.

We can go around the world in less time by journeying eastward; Justify it with Foggs's journey in the extract from 'Around the World in Eighty Days'.

When Fogg accepts the wager and starts eastward, he sees the sun pass the meridian eight times, while people in London see the sun pass the meridian only seventy-nine times. Thus, while going from East to West he gained a day when he crossed the International Date Line. Hence, we can go around the world in less time when we journey eastward.
